NOTICE OF REQUEST TO INCREASE RATES FOR THE 2026 GENERAL RATE CASE  
APPLICATION 24-09-001 (A.24-09-001)**

**Why am I receiving this notice?**

On September 6, 2024, Southwest Gas Corporation (Southwest Gas) filed its General Rate Case (GRC) Application (Application) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting a total increase of approximately \$2.5 million for its Northern California service territory. This will impact your monthly bill. If the CPUC approves this Application, Southwest Gas will recover forecasted costs in rates beginning January 1, 2026. Southwest Gas also proposes fixed annual increases of 2.75% for years 2027 through 2030.

Southwest Gas is required to file a GRC with the CPUC every five years to set its level of annual revenues. Annual revenues are the total amount of money a utility is allowed to collect through rates in a given year.

**Why is Southwest Gas requesting this rate increase?**

- To recover the cost of the significant investments made in its gas distribution system required to provide safe and reliable service to its California customers.
- To allow continued investment in Southwest Gas' gas distribution system to enhance safety and reliability.
- To reflect the current cost of providing safe and reliable service in rates, including increases in operating expenses due to inflation.
- Due to continued customer growth and the demand for natural gas service and the associated costs to provide service to these customers.

**How could this affect my monthly gas rates?**

If Southwest Gas' rate request is approved by the CPUC, the average residential monthly bill using 66 therms per month would increase by approximately \$1.35 or 1.2% beginning in 2026. Individual customer bills will vary.

<sup>[1]</sup> Proposed average rates reflect Southwest Gas' proposal in this GRC to consolidate its Northern California and South Lake Tahoe rate jurisdictions into one Northern California rate jurisdiction which results in an approximate \$2.5 million increase for Northern California. The total increase for Northern California without the consolidation is approximately \$63 thousand.

<sup>[2]</sup> There are currently no customers on these rate schedules.

### **How does the rest of this process work?**

This Application will be assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The Administrative Law Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt Southwest Gas' Application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding may review Southwest Gas' Application, including the Public Advocates Office. The Public Advocates Office is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
